

St Matthews Guides

The following week we had pancakes which is always a popular night with some of the girls actually tossing their pancakes and none landed on the floor.


We have also had an entertaining night of Karaoke which was requested by some of the girls this also involved dressing up as their favourite star.

Mystery of the Offertory plates

You will recall the mystery of the set of three pewter Offertory Plates in our church which logic said had been donated to St. Matthew's by our mother Church St. John the Divine in Pemberton. All were engraved with the names of two Churchwardens Thomas Moorfield and George Cauldwell and dated 1825. They had, we thought, donated the plates to St. John's church who later passed them on to us when St. Matthew's was opened in 1897. What we found difficult to explain was that St. John's, being a 'Waterloo Church', one of those built with Government Funds in gratitude for the British victory over Napoleon in 1815 at The Battle of Waterloo, was only built in 1832. Where were the plates from 1825 until 1832? Well, we now know!

Thanks to the detective work of William Sharp and his lovely sister Pat, we discover that Messrs. Moorfield and Cauldwell were actually Churchwardens of Wigan Parish Church in 1825, the mother church of

St. John the Divine. The plates were donated by them firstly to the Parish Church of All Saints and only eight vears later again donated to St. John's upon its opening. This is backed up by the fact that identical set of pewter plates were also donated to another 'Waterloo Church' built in Wigan and also dedicated and opened in 1832. This church is another daughter church of All Saints Parish Church and is St. David's at Haigh. Precisely what Messrs. Moorfield and Cauldwell thought of their six plates, bought by



them, probably at a not inconsiderable cost, being re-donated to two other churches only eight years later is not known. There was a change in incumbency at All Saints Parish Church at about that time. Perhaps the new Rector wanted a 'clear out' of the old. It is highly unlikely that any of them would have been around 65 years later when three of the plates were again passed on to St. Matthew's Church.

The winner of the competition is therefore William Sharp, and he will be welcome to take the Offertory at his convenience. Or not. Whatever he chooses. We are thankful to both of the Sharpe's for their detective work in this matter and all the other work they have and continue to do concerning the history of all the churches in the Wigan Deanery and in particular St. Matthew's Highfield. It shows that all things are open to everyone, but only if you know where to look!




